Cette réalité nous interpelle tous aujourd'hui puisque toutes les composantes de la société sont sollicitées et sont appelés à apporter des réponses adaptées à cette nouvelle réalité.

Cette conférence que le Maroc accueillera en septembre 2022 est la manifestation scientifique la plus importante au niveau international sur les questions migratoires.

C'est une série annuelle de forums rassemblements universitaires réunissant des académiciens, des chercheurs, des décideurs, des représentants des médias et de la société civile et des étudiants depuis 2012.

Chaque année, environ 500 participants d'environ 60 pays assistent et participent à plus de 80 sessions parallèles, tables rondes, ateliers et plénières.

Les initiateurs:

La Conférence sur la migration a été lancée par un comité exécutif composé du professeur Ibrahim Sirkeci de l'International Business School au Royaume-Uni, le professeur Jeffrey H. Cohen, de l'Ohio State University et le Pr Philip L. Martin de l'Université de Californie, Davis aux États-Unis.

Les premières conférences sur la migration ont été lancées en 2012 au Centre d'études transnationales sur le campus Regent's Park de l'Université Regent de Londres. Les conférences suivantes ont été organisées respectivement à Londres (2014), Prague (2015), Vienne (2016), Athènes (2017), Lisbonne (2018), Bari (2019), Tetovo (2020) et Londres (2021). En raison de la crise du COVID-19, les deux dernières éditions de la conférence se sont tenues en ligne.

Comment l'idée est née pour organiser la TMC 2022 au Maroc

La première participation de l'Association Marocaine d'Etudes et de Recherches sur les Migrations (AMERM) à ces conférences date de 2019 à l'université de Bari (500 participants) organisée par la Prof Michela Pellicani (membre du Conseil scientifique de l'AMERM). Lors de l'édition de Londres de 2021, le conseil scientifique de la TMC a proposé à l'AMERM d'organiser une session en français sur la migration marocaine coordonnée par le Pr Mohammed Khachani à laquelle ont pris part 6 chercheurs marocains, alors que la langue officielle de la Conférence est l'anglais. C'est lors de cette conférence de Londres que la proposition d'organiser l'édition 2022 au Maroc a été faite au président de l'AMERM.

Compte tenu de l'importance de cet événement qui demeure la principale et la plus importante manifestation scientifique mondiale sur la question migratoire, ce projet a été accueilli favorablement par Mr le président de l'Université Mohammed V de Rabat désigné comme coprésident de la TMC 2022 Rabat.

La plénière d'ouverture aura lieu dans les deux Amphi de la faculté des sciences juridiques, économiques et sociales Agdal, l'Amphi 1 (300 places) et l'Amphi 2 (250 places) qui sera relié par vidéo à l'Amphi 1. Les séances thématiques seront organisées dans 8 salles d'une capacité de plus de 40 places de 8h à 19h.

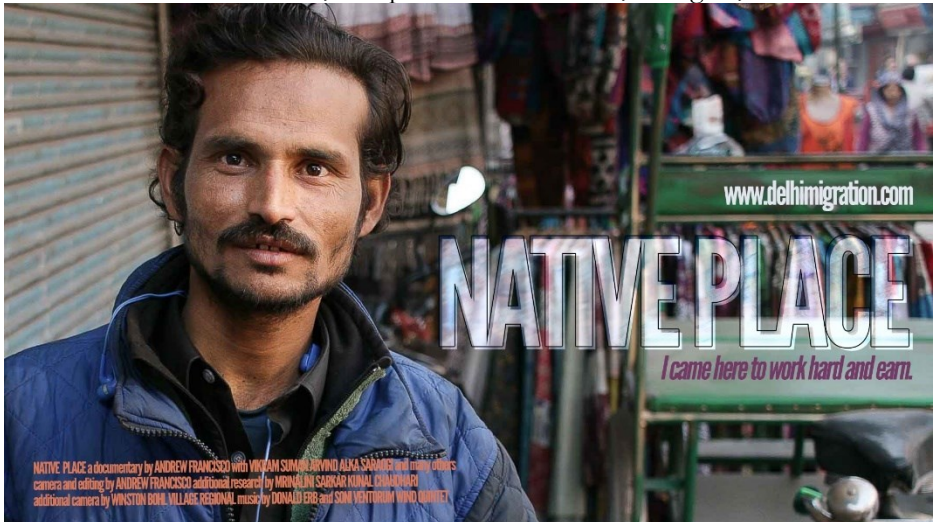
